

1929- National Blue and Corn Gold adopted as official colors


1930 - The official FFAcreed were adopted atthe third National FFAConvention.

1933- Blue Corduroy jacket adopted as official dress






More History ...

1944 – The National FFA Foundation was formed.


1950 – The U.S. Congress passed Public Law 740, which granted the FFA a Federal Charter.






– The "New Farmers" organization merged with the Future Farmers of America to create an integrated FFA.







To encourage members in the development of individual agriculture programs and establishment in agriculture.











Level of office


- The Chain Comand of Officers

Official Dress

• ALL FFA members are required to wear official dress while participating in official activities

Female Official Dress

- Black skirt.

Skirt is to be at least knee length, hemmed evenly across the bottom, with a slit no longer than 2 inches above the knee, excluding the kick pleat. Black slacks may be appropriate for traveling and outdoor activities.

- White collared blouse and official FFA blue scarf.
- Black dress shoes with a closed heel and toe (No boots, sandals, open-toed shoes, or tennis shoes.)
- Black nylon hosiery.
- Official FFA jacket zipped to the top.



Official Dress

Male Official Dress

- Black dress pants. (No jeans blue or black, leather, pleather, etc.)
- White dress shirt and official FFA tie
- Black dress shoes with a closed heel and toe. (No boots, sandals, open-toed shoes, tennis shoes.)
- Black socks.
- Official FFA jacket zipped to the top.

How to Wear Awards

- Chapter degree, officer and award medals should be worn beneath the name on the right side of the jacket.
- State FFA Degree or American Degree keys should be worn above the name on the right side of the jacket or attached to a standard key chain.
- No more than three medals should be worn on the jacket. These should represent highest degree earned, highest office held and the highest award earned.
